of Ballard Rosenberg Golper & Savitt; Intellectual Property/Trademark/Copyright Law, presented by Tal Ginblat, Esq. of Lewitt, Hackman, Shapiro, Marshall and Harlan; and Legal Writing, presented by Tish Pickett, Esq. of Polsinelli.

The keynote speaker this year was Dr. Thomas D. Allison, Esq., Professor, Attorney, and Judge Pro Tem who spoke on "Leadership in Law: Enhancing Legal Operations Through Personality Profiles, Leadership Styles, and a Culture of Authenticity."

The afternoon CLE breakout sessions were concentrated on Litigation, with presentations on Legal Investigations by Kelly Cory of Keystone Investigative Services; Trial Preparation by Adesh Singh, Esq. of Goldberg Segalla; and Judgment Enforcement by Melody Anderson, Esq. and Racel Barlongo, Paralegal, of the Law Offices of Kenneth J. Freed. There was also a presentation on Landlord/ Tenant Law by Arthur Wood, Esq., Kathy Ussery, Paralegal, and Travis Chow, Paralegal.

In addition, Doug Kuhn, CP and Terry Wright, ACP gave a presentation to attendees who are preparing to the sit for the National Association of Legal Assistants (NALA) Certified Paralegal (CP) exam.

The day ended with an Ethics CLE presented by Robert L. Kehr, Esq. and Rachelle Cohen, Esq. of Valensi Rose, PLC on "Legal Ethics: Must-know Principles to Succeed as a Legal Professional." This session was especially interesting because Mr. Kehr was a member of the Committee for the Revision of the Rules of Professional Conduct that drafted California's current Rules of Professional Conduct.






Providing Pro Bono Legal Services






PUBLIC COUNSEL







Indigenous Poet Laurate Joy Harjo recounts in her second memoir the foundations of how she came to write poetry that spoke of her Muscogee (Creek) Nation traditions and her




